Citizen comments may not be used to air personal attacks, to air personality grievances, to make political endorsements, or for political campaign purposes. Council members will not enter into a dialogue with citizens, nor will any decisions be made at that presentation.

Questions from the Council will be for clarification only. Public comments will not be used as a time for problem solving or reacting to the comments made, but rather for hearing the public for information only. If appropriate, the Mayor may assign staff for follow up to the issues raised.
