**City Council Opening**

Lilydale residents may apply to fill a vacancy on the city council following the departure of Marilyn Lundberg. The city council will appoint someone to fill the seat on an interim basis until the next city election in November 2018. At that time a candidate would be elected to serve the remaining two years of Lundberg’s four-year term.

Applications are being accepted through March 9, 2017. To be eligible for consideration, you must be a U.S. citizen, a resident of Lilydale, a qualified city voter, and at least 21 years old. To apply, submit a resume and a letter explaining why you would like to serve on the council to the city clerk. Councilmembers Bob Bullard and Marilyn Lundberg served the City of Lilydale for a total sum of 25 years, ending their tenure on the city council in recent weeks. Both were commended by the city council at the February council meeting for their dedication and service to the community.

Councilmember Bullard was first appointed to serve as a member of the Lilydale city council in February 2002, and was elected and reelected in each election through 2014. Councilmember Bullard was chairman of the Lower Mississippi River Water Management Organization, a member of the city’s finance committee, and the council’s delegate on numerous important projects and committees within the city and with other government agencies.

During her 10 years of service on the city council, Councilmember Lundberg provided dedicated, valuable service in carrying out all of her official responsibilities. In addition, she was actively involved in representing Lilydale on the Lower Mississippi River Watershed Management Organization, assumed a leading role in addressing environmental issues, and advocated for Lilydale with our legislative representatives.

On February 9, 2017, the city council appointed former mayor Anita Pampusch to fill the remainder of Councilmember Bullard’s term ending in December 2018.
