City Council Member Appointed

Lyle Hanzal was sworn into office as a Lilydale city council member on May 8, 2017. A resident of Lexington Riverside, Lyle was appointed to fill the term vacated by Marilyn Lundberg. He will serve until the next city election in November 2018.

Candidates that applied for the opening were interviewed by the Lilydale city council in March. The Council was pleased with the amount of interest shown in serving the community.

Watershed Delegates Named

As a member of the Lower Mississippi River Watershed Management Organization (LMRWMO), Lilydale recently named two representatives to the board. Tom Sutton, a Lilydale planning commissioner was appointed as a board manager, and Lyle Hanzal will serve as a board alternate. Prior to their appointment, Lilydale was well represented on the LMRWMO for many years by the contributions of Bob Bullard and Marilyn Lundberg.

Stormwater Pollution Prevention

Urban stormwater frequently contains pollutants such as litter, pesticides, fertilizers, oils, salt, sediment, and other debris that can impair our ponds, lakes, rivers and wetlands. To reduce stormwater pollution, the City of Lilydale has created and implemented a Stormwater Pollution Prevention Program (SWPPP) with six important components: 1) public education and outreach; 2) public participation/involvement; 3) direction and elimination of illegal discharges; 4) construction-site runoff control; 5) post-construction runoff control; 6) pollution prevention/good housekeeping. A copy of the SWPPP is available for review at Lilydale City Hall and on the city's website lilydale.govoffice.com.



These items will be reviewed and discussed at the Lilydale city council meeting on June 12, 2017 at 4:30 p.m. Lilydale residents are encouraged to attend and offer input on the SWPPP. Citizens Police Academy

Lilydale residents and business owners are invited to participate in the Mendota Heights Citizens Police Academy. Classes begin September 14 and run through November 16, Thursdays from 6:00—9:30 p.m.

The Citizens Police Academy is designed to give citizens a working knowledge of the operations and responsibilities of the police department, fire department and sheriff's office, which serve our community.

Students will get hands on instruction from officers in the areas of criminal investigations, traffic stops, use of force, firearms, and DWI sobriety testing. There are also field trips to police training facilities, the Dakota County Jail, and the Mendota Heights Fire Department.

Thieves need less than 20 seconds to steal:

laptops, I-Pad, cell phone, other electronics

back packs or gym bags
GPS, garage door opener
purse, wallet, checkbook
cash / spare change



Thefts from autos can happen in:

parks
public parking areas
on-street parking
your driveway
garages
(including underground secured parking areas)

Theft can occur any time of day.

Tips to prevent theft:

- Lock your car doors and roll up your windows tight.
- Leave objects of value at home. If you must bring them with you, do not leave them in plain view. (Thieves know the "purse under the seat" hiding place.)
- Place valuables in the car trunk BEFORE you reach your destination (thieves may be watching).
- When you leave and return home through your garage, watch your garage door close completely (thieves may be lurking).
- Keep your garage door closed and lock any inside entry door.
- Provide extra security for particularly vulnerable targets (bicycles, power tools, etc.) inside the garage.
- Alert police to suspicious acting people loitering or lurking in the area of parked vehicles. Call 911.
- Share the above tips with family, friends, neighbors and visitors to your home.

Comprehensive Plan Update Underway

As part of the seven county metropolitan area, Lilydale is required by the Metropolitan Land Planning Act to update its Comprehensive Plan for submission to the Metropolitan Council for review and approval. Our city planning commission, consisting of residents: John Diehl, Brian Folkman, Jerry Friedmann, Roxanne Sands, Tom Sutton and Tom Swain has begun the update to be completed by mid-2018, and is assisted on an “over the shoulder” basis by a local consulting firm, Stantec as well as staff from the Metropolitan Council. Not unlike Lilydale’s plan update in 2008, it is anticipated that there will not be significant change, considering the city’s geography, stable population, limited potential for commercial development, and other factors. However, the planning commission has begun evaluating major planning areas including land use, transportation, waste water, surface water, water supply, parks and trails, and housing.

It is important to the city council and planning commission that Lilydale residents have the opportunity to participate in the planning process. If residents have comments, suggestion, concerns, opportunities for improvement, etc., pertaining to planning areas, they are encouraged to contact Mary Schultz, city administrator. A public meeting on the planning process will be scheduled for early fall of the this year to provide an opportunity for resident input.

Highway 110 Road Construction

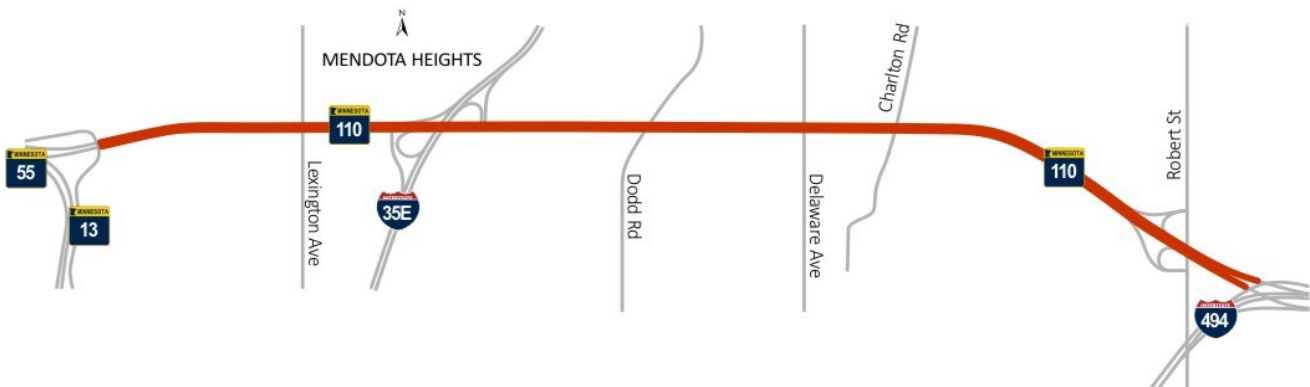
The Minnesota Department of Transportation will be reconstructing Highway 110 from Highway 55 to I-494. Consequently, Lilydale will likely experience increased traffic on Hwy. 13.

Eastbound Hwy. 110 between I-35E and I-494 will be closed June 12 through July 24.

Westbound Hwy. 110 closure and detour will occur after the Eastbound Hwy. 110 lanes are open (tentatively scheduled for July 24).

This one-construction season project is expected to run through the fall of 2017. Please be attentive, drive with caution, slow down in work zones and never enter a road blocked with barriers or cones. Do you have unwanted, expired or unused medicine? Dispose of it the safe way.

WHERE: Mendota Heights Police Department Lobby

WHEN: Any time; open 24 hrs. day

HOW TO DROP OFF YOUR MEDICINE:

- Drop-off is safe and anonymous. No ID is required and no questions will be asked.
- Keep medicine in original container and cross out your name on the container. Place in a sealed, clear plastic bag. If you do not have the original container, place in a clear plastic bag and write the name of the medicine on the bag.



WHAT'S ACCEPTED:

Prescription, over-the-counter and pet medications in any form (e.g., pill, liquid, cream, spray, powder) from households only. Vials, IV bags, EpiPens®, inhalers and patches are also accepted.

WHAT'S NOT ACCEPTED:

No needles, syringes, lancets, or thermometers. Bring these to the Dakota County Recycling Zone. No medications from businesses (e.g., health care facilities, pharmacies, veterinary clinics).



Medications should never be flushed down the toilet, poured down the sink, or placed in the trash.
