Vote by Absentee Ballot

Absentee voting is available for those who wish to vote before election day. Due to COVID-19, residents are encouraged to vote by mail this year, if possible.



Absentee Vote by Mail—Apply for an absentee ballot online at MNVotes.org. After applying for a ballot it will be mailed to you and it can be returned by mail or brought to one of the Dakota County Service Centers listed below.

Sign up to drop off food waste

Bring your food scraps and napkins to an organics drop-off site in Dakota County:

Dakota Lodge, Thompson County Park, 1200 Stassen Road, West St. Paul
Holland Lake Trailhead, Lebanon Hills Regional Park, 1100 Cliff Road, Eagan

Organics collected are taken to a local commercial compost facility where it will turn into compost, a nutrient-rich soil additive.

Residents must sign up to drop off by emailing organics@co.dakota.mn.us, calling 952-891-7557 or go online www.dakotacounty.us search *organics*. Participants will receive a how-to guide for organics recycling and free compostable bags.

Let's get back to basics

It's time to get back to recycling basics. Only when our recycling is clean and without contamination does it help protect our forests, lakes and air. Minnesotans are throwing away more than 285,000 tons of paper and 12,000 tons of aluminum cans each year — all of which have been recyclable for decades. Be a confident recycler by following these rules:

- Do not use plastic bags for recyclables
- Recycle bottles, cans, and paper – keep them empty and dry
- Keep plastic bags, batteries, and things that can tangle out of your recycling cart
- When in doubt, throw it out – no more hoping that an item is recyclable. If you don't know, don't recycle it. Keep out things you're not sure about – only clean recycling gets recycled.

Use the online Recycling Guide at www.dakotacounty.us to help know if an item is recyclable and where to take items that aren't recyclable.
